## Printing STATA graphs on Athena

Say you have done a scatterplot using this command

graph y x

(1) Save your graph in your current directory, using a ".gph" suffix for the file name:

graph y x, saving(mygraph.gph) Where mygraph is the name of the graph you use.

Note: if you had previously saved mygraph.gph and want to write over it, issue this command:

graph y x,saving(mygraph.gph,replace)

(2) Translate mygraph.gph into a Postscript file. Within STATA type:

gphpen mygraph.gph

Do not confuse the "gphpen" command with "gph pen", which sets a different darkness/thickness to lines on your graph.

- (3) Print the graph with a standard UNIX command.
  - (a) Outside of STATA (at the Athena prompt):

lpr mygraph.ps

(b) Inside of STATA (at the STATA prompt):

!lpr mygraph.ps
