

Mood of the United States





Presidential Job Approval






Most Important Problem (Jan 1999 – Present)



When thinking about your next airline flight, how would you describe your comfort level with flying at this time?








Alternatives to Commercial Air Travel Catching On

How many meetings have you attended via video teleconferencing or the internet during the last six months that you would have otherwise flown to?






Top Reason NOT to Fly: "None of the above"

BROWN is **frustrated by the delays and hassles** of flying following tighter security and has decided NOT to travel until it is more convenient.


JONES is concerned about the uncertain economy and has decided NOT to travel in order to save money,







Poor airline maintenance the greater threat Returning to Pre-9/11 Levels




Which do you think is a greater threat to airline safety: terrorist attacks or poor airline maintenance?

Which of the following five safety concerns worry you the most?








Now Americans Much More Concerned About Mechanical Safety

Which of the following five safety concerns worry you the most?









Airline Security Measures


Airlines Have Done All Right, But Could Do More

Public Willingness to Undergo More Intrusive Bag Checks and Passenger Searches




Would you be willing to experience longer and more intrusive bag checks and passenger searches when flying in order to improve airport and airline security 15




General Public Confidence in Airport Security

When you fly on commercial airlines, how confident are you that airport security will prevent terrorists from bringing bombs or weapons on the plane?






Many travelers have been stopped for a random search of baggage

Most travelers have been delayed by security checks and believe it is necessary






Does Talking About Airline Safety Make People Feel Safer or Make Them More Concerned?
