  - ↳ 26 fraternities comprised of 1035 members



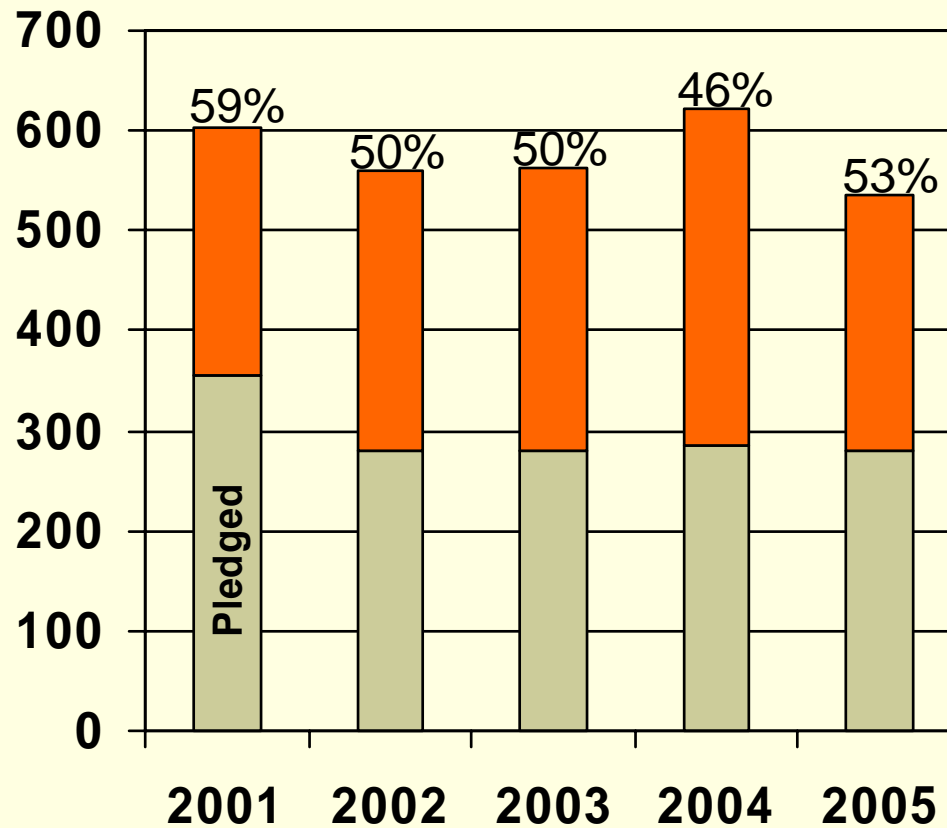
# In the past 6 months...

- Orientation:
  - ↳ Highest IFC involvement in recent history
  - ↳ 100% of Orientation Leaders were Greek
- Rush 2005
  - ↳ 53% male freshmen pledged
  - ↳ Retention becoming increasingly important
- Expansion of IFC infrastructure
  - ↳ Standards Forum & Standards Board

# IFC Recruitment 2005

- 344 freshmen males (64%) received 430 bids
- 281 freshmen (53% of males) pledged
- Average chapter pledged 10.8 freshmen
- This is an improvement over previous years, but the system is not yet sustainable
- Retention is becoming increasingly important
  - ↳ Last year, 43 rising sophomores chose not to move in
