  - Train RMCs; educate chapter officers on RM policies
- Recruitment Chair
  - Liaise with Panhel, admissions, SLOPE; educate and enforce rush rules
- Program Development Chair
  - Lead programming initiatives: dinner swaps/Greek letter/Greek week
- Executive Assistant
  - Secretarial duties; accounting and dues collection

- Revisit risk management policies to ensure they encourage safety, are appropriately enforceable, and minimize liability
