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1. Why the team deserves our help

- In recent years, MIT Basketball has built on its proud tradition, in a way that all MIT alumni should be proud of...
 - In the past 7 years, a 117-77 W-L record, 2 NEWMAC conference championships, 3 NCAA All-Americans, 2 NEWMAC MVPs, 1 Consensus NCAA DIII Player of the Year, and 2 NCAA Division III Tournament berths
 - The current team maintains a ~4.5 GPA, supplemented with all of the achievements in research, internships and post-graduate jobs expected of great MIT students
 - Strong leadership from Head Coach Larry Anderson, entering his 16th season as the winningest coach in MIT Basketball history, 2 time NEWMAC Coach of the Year, New England Basketball Hall of Fame Division III Coach of the Year and two NCAA Division III Team Sportsmanship Awards
 - MIT Basketball has become a rallying activity for the student body, and our athletes are deeply involved in many aspects of student life
- ...in spite of fewer relative resources.
 - In the past 10 years Institute resources have remained consistent, while costs have risen
 - Some examples of limited resources from MIT Basketball:
 - A top notch staff of assistants volunteer their time for less than \$4000/year apiece
 - MIT is beginning to compete for the attention of the very best student-athletes, in spite of a recruiting budget of only \$1500/year
 - Our competitors in Division III and the Ivy League often boast advantages in facilities, equipment and travel
 - Alumni support to date has been greatly appreciated, but has occurred on mostly an ad-hoc basis
- MIT Basketball has played a important part in our own lives, and continues to progress towards the overall MIT standard of excellence. Current and future players deserve our help to offer the highest quality competitive experience.



2. Goals

- Develop \$220K endowed fund to commemorate the 110th anniversary of MIT Basketball
 - *Supports a \$10-12k increase in annual operating budget for the team*
- 75%+ Participation
 - *All MIT Basketball Alumni give something back in support of the MIT Basketball experience*
 - *Minimum gift of \$110, although any amount counts*
- Continued friend-raising
 - *Make our request for gifts in a manner consistent with the values of MIT, DAPER & MIT Basketball*
 - *Leave those unable to give with a feeling of being included as part of the Basketball Alumni*
 - *Leave donors feeling knowledgeable about what they have given to and good about what they are supporting*
- Set a standard for future fundraising efforts
 - *Understanding that there is more that we can do longer term e.g. create an endowment of the head coach's chair, a new basketball facility*

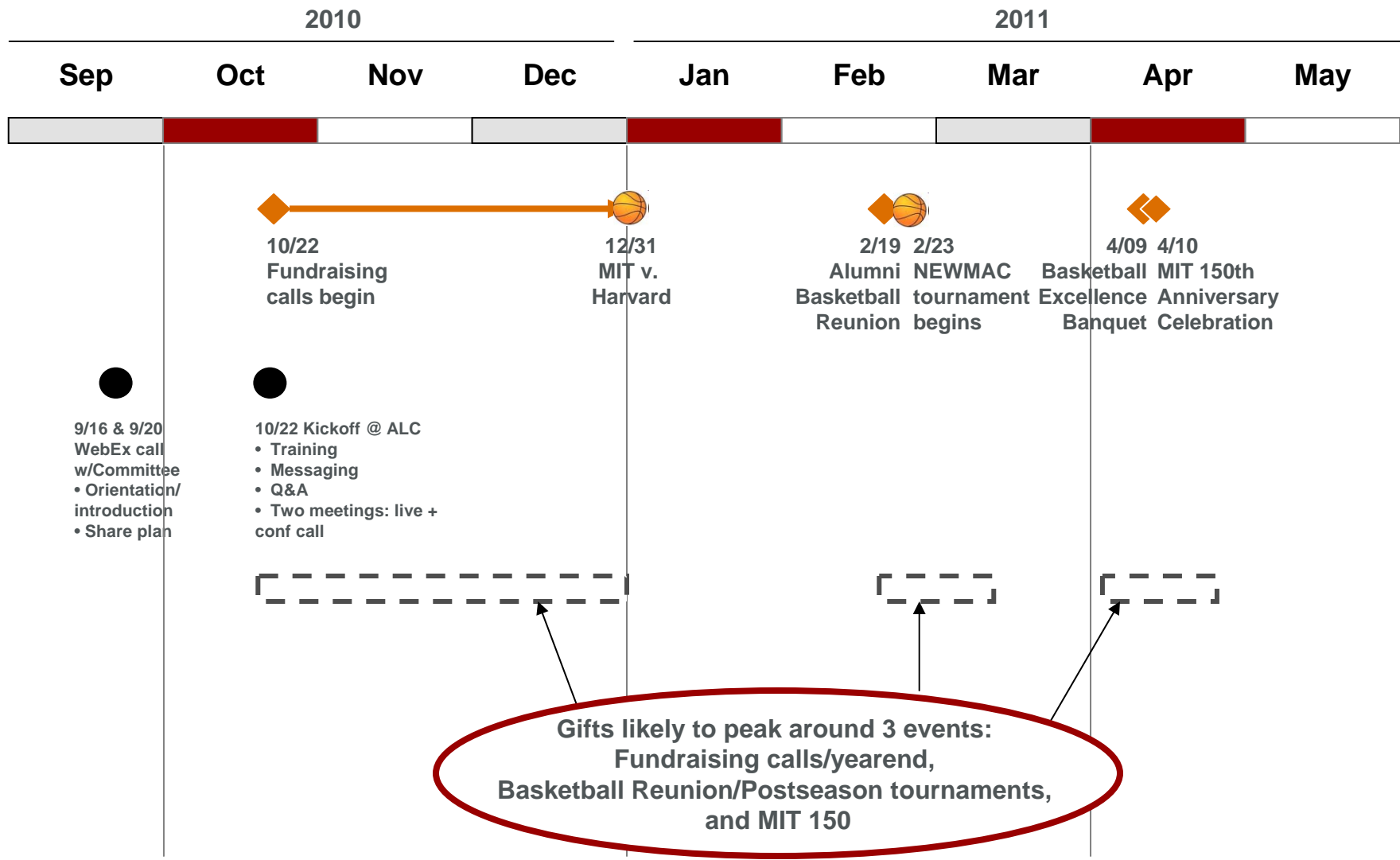

7. The role of Committee members

- Reach out to other MIT Basketball alumni to gather gifts and support
 - We are trying to limit to ~10 calls per person, so you can have a few high value discussions with your peers and former teammates rather than a long call sheet
 - In addition to a gift, generate participation for the Harvard game (12/31/10), the 110th Anniversary Alumni Day (2/19/11), and MIT 150, with events hosted by DAPER and MIT Basketball
 - Ask for help: Although you will make the initial contacts, please do ask for support. We have experienced fundraisers, other alumni, Head Coach Larry Anderson and Athletic Director Julie Soriero on standby ready to help

- Make a gift
 - One of the requirements of our core committee is to make a gift – it's an effective way to lead as you go out to talk to other alumni
 - e.g. "I'm putting up \$5000, I know you can do the same"

- Check in
 - We will hold optional monthly conference calls to check-in and highlight progress
 - Regular email correspondence with the steering committee and update the online tool

Frequently Asked Questions (I)

- How can I be sure that my gift will provide support for the team, and without reducing the Institute funding to the program?
 - The Steering Committee has received assurances from Athletic Director Julie Soriero that within DAPER, the money raised will always supplement Men's Basketball's MIT operational budget
 - With the help of Theresa Lee, Director of the MIT Annual Fund, we are also developing governance language for the endowed fund that will ensure this outcome.

- What oversight will exist over how the funds are used?
 - Current DAPER and MIT policy and procedure requires that a DAPER financial controller has direct access to the funds. The Head Coach must make a request for funds through the financial controller. For large requests, the financial controller alerts the Athletic Director's office, who will request an explanation from the head coach. The financial controller also triggers standard NCAA compliance and accounting audits around all expenditures.
 - A fund like this typically does not have a separate alumni oversight board. Such boards are administratively onerous for smaller MIT endowments such as this one.

- What happens if the team does not use all of its endowment budget for a season?
 - Excess funds will be either be rolled over to the budget for the following year or returned to principal to help grow the endowment, at the discretion of the Head Coach and DAPER
 - We would expect use of funds to be somewhat cyclical – NCAA Division III rules permit international trips only every 4 years.



Frequently Asked Questions (II)

- What do we mean by 'recruiting'?
 - "Recruiting" MIT-style is about identifying and building relationships with academically qualified prospective students, and showing them that they have to sacrifice neither their academic nor athletic potential by attending MIT. Unlike almost any other program in the country, we still await the judgment of MIT admissions to find out which of these students are admitted.
 - With all the negative press surrounding NCAA recruiting, under the table dealings and the exploitation of athletes, rest assured that MIT is staying as far away from those models as it can.

- Is my gift tax-deductible?
 - Yes, the gift is comparable to any gift to MIT, and is fully tax deductible as MIT is a registered non-profit academic institution
 - A gift to the program also counts towards your alumni gift credits and a class gift credit in an reunion year. For gifts of greater than \$5k, donors are given DAPER Leadership Circle donor credit.



Messaging

To updated prior to October training session

Our goals will be best accomplished by each member of the team initiating a personal conversation with their peers in their own words.

A script will be provided in a training session in October for those that would like one.

Key messages

- **MIT Basketball has continued to improve in the tradition of MIT**
 - Becoming more competitive both on the court and in the lab
- **This in spite of a flat budget and rising costs**
- **It's time for the alumni to step in and help continue to improve the experience**
- **We're raising a \$220K endowment that will add \$10-12K to the \$38K operating budget**
- **Improvements to coaching, travel, recruiting will mean a lot to the team**
- **We need your gift to achieve our goal, and your support against Harvard and on Alumni Day**

Do

- **Get personal** – Use this as an opportunity to share your own experience with the team and to reminisce with former teammates
- **Advertise your gift** - Ask your teammates to join you in a gift appropriate to your era and financial means
- **Be concrete** – Try to get a commitment for a specific amount, as well as a sense of when the gift will be made.
- **Connect through the current team** - Talk about the recent success of the program and upcoming events. We want participation and involvement, not just a gift
- **Be creative** – Competitions within the committee and between eras/teams are highly encouraged

Don't

- **Disparage the efforts of MIT or DAPER** – the support of MIT/DAPER has been critical to our success to date, and this effort is meant to sustain and improve this experience
- **Over-pressure** – "no" is a disappointing, but acceptable, answer. Try to be sensitive to personal situations.
- **Overpromise** – 'Special requests' from alumni with their gifts should be referred back to the steering committee
