
Leon Cumani's Last Will and Testimate

As the will currently stands, Leon's estate (valued at \$150,000) is to be divided evenly among his three children Thomas Cumani, William Cumani and Debora Weinstein.

The execution of the will will take several months. As such, none of the money can be used for in-game monetary goals. Thus, this sheet is only relevant for determining long term post-game wealth.

Reapportion Shares of the Estate

If for a beneficiary decides that Leon's estate should be apportioned differently, they may reassign some or all of their share by writing up an in-game document explaining how much of their share they'd like to assign and to whom. They sign it and get two other people to sign it witnessing the signature. If the resulting document makes it back to Springfield in the hands of someone who wants to publicize it, the changes will be taken into account when the will is executed.

Marriage, Divorce, and Annulment

Should either Thomas or William decide to take a wife post-game, their wife would naturally share in their portion of the estate.

Should Debora and Benjamin Weinstein remain married, they would share Debora's portion. Should they decided to get divorced post-game, Debora's share would be split between them as they were married at the time of Leon's death. Should their marriage get annulled post-game, Debora would retain her entire share.

Death of Beneficiaries

All portions of the estate that are designate for people who die before the will can be executed are divided evenly among the surviving beneficiaries.
