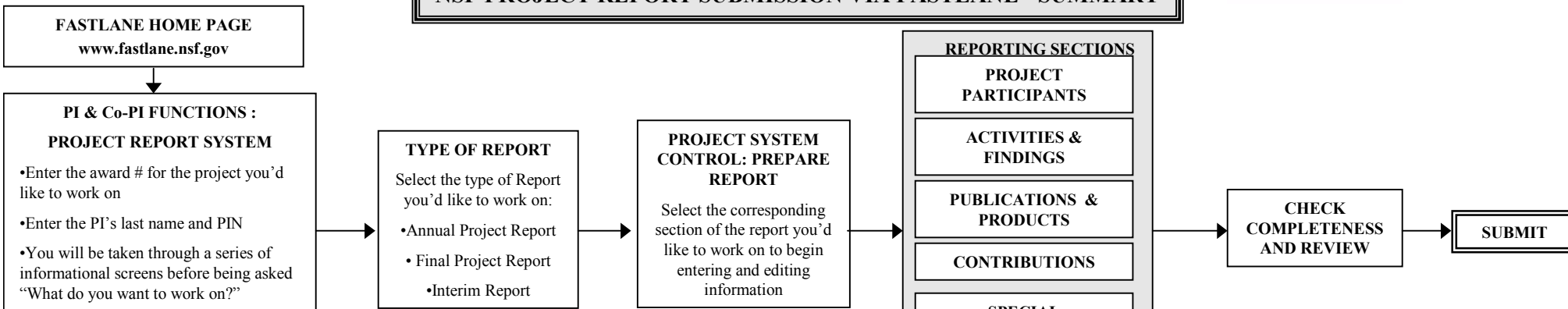
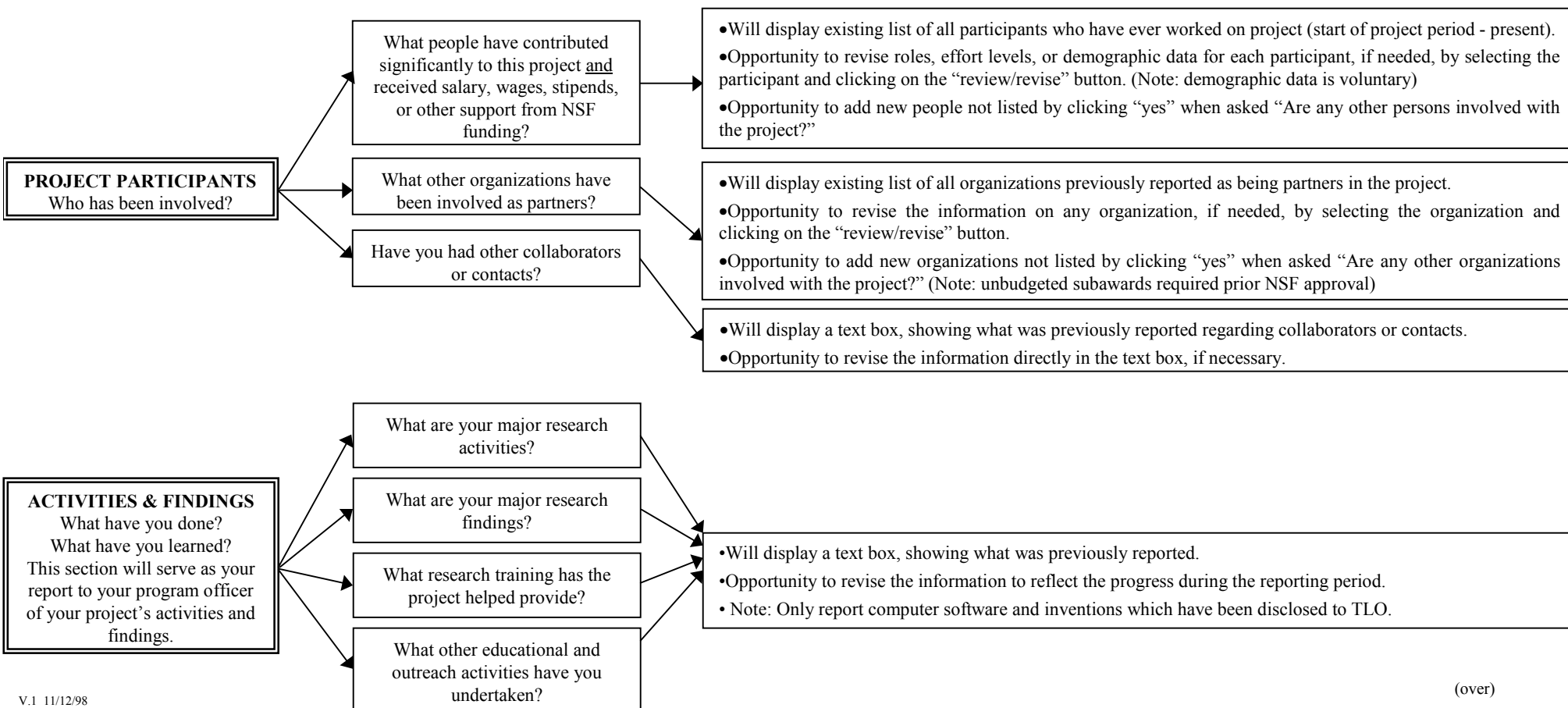

- If unobligated funds will be less than 20%, click “no”
