Remember, all of the categories here are things that tourists at MIT are known to take pictures of.

Picture Categories:

- in front of a coach bus
- in front of 77 Mass Ave
- in front of the MIT Seal
- in front of the Great Dome
- in front of the Stata Center
- in front of the Green Building
- in front of an Athena Cluster
- in front of a T station
- in front of Johnson Athletic Center
- in front of the Student Center
- under the white cranes in Stata
- with a bulletin board of event ads
- with a bulletin board of Undergraduate Association executive members
- with an outdoor art piece
- in front of a bathroom door
- in Building 10
- of the interior of the Lobby 7 dome
- of a person reading a thick book under a tree in Killian Court
- of people playing frisbee in Killian Court
- with a tour guide

Subject Categories:

- a photobomber
- someone with a DSLR around his/her neck
- someone with MIT-branded clothing
- someone with Harvard-branded clothing
- someone mixing at least two other (non-MIT, non-Harvard) pieces of university-branded clothing
- someone with a fanny pack
- an unsuspecting student
- an unsuspecting professor (either identify the professor in the caption, or make sure HQ is convinced that it's a professor... which is open to your interpretation)
- someone holding an MIT map
- someone jumping in the air while holding up two peace signs

Rules:

- 1 point is given for the first occurrence of a picture category in the album (a picture may only be from one category).
- 1 point is given for the first occurrence of a subject category in the album.
- People in pictures may fall under multiple subject categories and gain points for the number of categories they are under.
- Each picture must feature at least two things from the subjects list, even if the subjects do not accrue points because they also appeared earlier in the album.
- Label each picture with the categories (both of pictures and subjects) that it falls under.
- There must be at least s subject categories in the album, where $s = \min(n/6, 8)$, rounded down to the nearest integer, where n is the size of the team.
- The album must total at least p points, where $p = \min(n/3, 26)$, rounded down to the nearest integer.
- The album must contain at least 10 pictures.
