## The Playfair Cipher

The Playfair cipher encodes words and messages with the use of a $5 \times 5$ grid that contains each letter of the alphabet once (1 and Joccupt the same square and are considered interchangeable). A specific keyword, $n$ letters long with no repeating letters, is chosen. Moving lett to right and top to bottom. the first $n$ spaces of the grid are filled with the keyword. Then the rest of the grid is filled with the remainder of the alphabet in order

## How text is encoded:

The lext is broken into two-letter pairs. Proper spacing and punctuation is noted. If a letter is repeated within a two-letter block, a dunm letter (X or $Q$ ) is mserted between them. If the message ends with a single letter, a dunmy letter is added to the end. Then each letter pair is located withm the Plat fair grid and encoded as tollows:

- The two letters occupy different rows and different columns. The letters are treated as two comers of a rectangle. They are replaced by the ketters that torm the other two comers of the rectangle. Our convention is to match top comer to top comer, bottom comer to bottom comer

#### Abstract

This is a four-dimensional puzzle. Take the 1353 -letter words, names, and abbreviations (ignore capitalization and punctuation) and construct five $3 \times 3 \times 3$ word cubes. (Envision three word squares stacked on top of one another.) To illustrate, get a die and position it so the 6 is on top and the 4 faces you. Nine words read from the 6 face to the 1 face, nine words go from 2 to 5 , and nine go from 3 to 4 . (You could also use the perspective 6 to 1,2 to 5 , and 4 to 3 ; it will work the same. Just be consistent.) Each word is used only once. When you have done this, if you arrange the cubes in a certain order, a word will read through the five center squares of the cubes. This fourthdimensional word is the answer.
