Frederick Gardiner Fasset, Jr. Award

Description:

The Frederick Gardiner Fasset, Jr. Award is presented annually to the **individual** male and female member of FSILG Community who has most unselfishly demonstrated the qualities of spirit, dedication, and service in furthering the ideals of MIT brotherhood and sisterhood.

Criteria:

- A letter of recommendation and endorsement should be submitted that talks of the deserving nature of the candidate.
- List all significant positions or offices this person has held in your FSILG, IFC, Panhellenic Association, or LGC, and any other MIT organization.
- How has this person fostered the ideals of brotherhood, sisterhood, or membership in your organization and within the FSILG Community?
- What impact has this person made on the organization and the community?

David N. Rogers Ideals and Values Award

Description:

This award is named for the former Dean of Fraternities, Sororities, and Independent Living Groups. We all pursue the values of character, scholarship, leadership, service, and fraternity; however, the recipient of this award will have incorporated these values into their every day actions and guided other members of the community to the realization of what it truly means to be Greek.

Criteria:

Chapters will be evaluated based on their fulfillment of the Ideal Greek Community Vision Statement: We are one united community in our pursuit of shared values: character, scholarship, leadership, service, and fraternity. These shared values form our collective bond that is strengthened by our diverse experiences. Mindful of our responsibility to honor our values, we support and hold each other accountable. Our actions resonate not only within our organizations, but also in the global community.

James R. Killian, Jr. Community Service Award

Description:

The James R. Killian, Jr. Community Service Award is presented to the FSILG **organization** with the most outstanding community service program. The award is made in honor of Dr. James Killian, Jr., an avid supporter of MIT's FSILGs and president of MIT from 1949-1959. Excellence in community relations is also essential to the award.

Criteria:

- What incentives does your FSILG employ to foster community spirit in its members?
- What does your FSILG find most important about community service, and why?
- A comprehensive list all community service activities and events your FSILG has participated in since the previous spring semester. For each activity, list the number of members that participated and total hours worked or total dollars contributed. Attach supporting documentation (flyers, pictures, press releases, etc.)
- Comment additionally on anything you feel is pertinent to the Community Service Award.

Kenneth R. Wadleigh Faculty Relations Award

Description:

The Kenneth R. Wadleigh Award is presented to the FSILG **organization** that has best promoted and encouraged faculty-student interaction in the organization. The award is made in

honor of Kenneth R. Wadleigh, former Dean of Student Affairs and Vice President and Dean of the Graduate School from 1975-1983, for his long-standing commitment and service to the FSILG Community at MIT. Selections are based on program innovation, excellence, and effectiveness.

Criteria:

- What are the strongest qualities of your faculty relations program?
- What has your organization done to improve faculty relations since the previous spring semester?
- How has your organization benefited from your faculty relations?
- Give a detailed description of your faculty relations activities and events since the previous spring semester.
- Comment additionally on anything you feel is pertinent to the Faculty Relations Award.

Senior Legacy Awards

Description:

Senior Legacy Awards are presented to **individual** members of the graduating class who have made extraordinary contributions to the FSILG Community and who have implemented programs, events, or new traditions that promote the values of the FSILG Community.

Criteria:

Give a detailed description of the program, idea, or tradition that the nominee has implemented for his or her chapter or for the FSILG Community, as well as a detailed account of why this new idea has impacted or will impact the FSILG Community positively in the future.

Outstanding Resident Advisor Awards

Description:

The Outstanding Resident Advisor Awards are presented to Resident Advisors who have provided outstanding service to the FSILG in the past year. Nominees should have performed above and beyond the expectations of the job.

Criteria:

- Why is the Resident Advisor being nominated?
- What impact as the Resident Advisor had on the organization and its members?
- Comment additionally on anything you feel is pertinent to the Outstanding Resident Advisor Award

Outstanding Alumnus Advisor Awards

Description:

The Outstanding Alumnus Advisor Awards recognize outstanding Chapter Advisor or House Corporation members who best exemplify the value volunteer service to the FSILG community or to an individual FSILG.

Criteria:

- Why is the Alumnus Advisor being nominated?
- What impact as the Alumnus Advisor had on the organization and its members?
- Comment additionally on anything you feel is pertinent to the Outstanding Alumnus Advisor Award

Order of Omega Scholarship Honor Roll

Description:

The Scholarship Honor Roll will honor FSILGs that meet high standards of academic excellence. Decided on organizational GPA, the top 1/3 of FSILGs for the previous Spring and Fall semesters will be honored as members of the Scholarship Honor Roll.
