On Sunday, May 1, 2011 from 12 to 7 pm., the Day of Russia in Boston will be celebrated. The goal of this event is to reinforce cultural interactions between the diverse Russian and American communities in Greater Boston, by promoting the strong ties in the long relationship between American and Russian cultures. An art exhibit presenting paintings about Russian Imperialism of the 19th century by internationally renowned artist, Stass Shpanin, will be featured at the event in the "From Russia with Art Gallery." The exhibit will be on public display from April 17 to May 22.

This exhibit will present premier artworks by Stass, made with journalistic accuracy but at the same time with individual expressionism, describing the paradoxical life of Russia during its Silver Ages. This includes paintings of Tsar's family every day duties as well as genre scenes from the time. Of course, the Day of Russia event will not be celebrated without a "Samovar" (authentic Russian tea boiler), which is the name of one of the paintings by Stass Shpanin.

The Russian American Cultural Center at Russia Wharf, Inc.
