



- I added a border, reduced the size, and erased the lady with her dog. This statue is a part of the Boston Women's Memorial on Commonwealth Avenue. It's dedicated to three important women in Boston's history: Abigail Adams, Lucy Stone, and Phillis Wheatley. It's one of my favorite memorials along Commonwealth.
