






# Foreword.

### The Season of 1923 in Athletics

PERUSAL of the combined records of Technology's athletic teams shows the somewhat checkered performances of the branches of sport that the Institute supports. It is interesting to note that a major sport, upon the success of which a great deal depends, after the most careful training, may give but passable account of itself, while a minor sport which has received the minimum of support and publicity for years, will distinguish itself by a list of unusual accomplishments.

The Track season was reasonably prosperous. The team made its best showing against the University of Maine, leaving that institution far behind. Its contact with Harvard and Dartmouth was less fortunate, for both clashes resulted in defeats for the Engineers. The chief disappointment of the season came in Technology's inability to take the final leg of the New England Intercollegiates which would have made it the permanent holder of the Briggs trophy. Bowdoin managed to corner the few critical points that decided the award.

Cross Country began auspiciously by vanquishing Cornell and Harvard and throughout its season continued to build up a creditable record. The Crew were matched against some of the strongest combinations of oarsmen in the country and the game struggles they made against undoubted odds leave little but actual victory to be desired.

Tennis made an enviable record as did Golf, the latter being defeated only by Harvard, with a very narrow margin, and taking most of its matches easily. The Basketball Team, though not as invincible as its predecessor, contrived to uphold its reputation and add new victories to its credit. The Gym Team handled the most difficult program that has come the way of any of its fore-runners, with encouraging results. Soccer played the entire season without a single defeat and the Wrestlers took second place in their Intercollegiate Meet.

Technology managers never attempt to foster a false self-confidence by engaging contests with teams of inferior prowess whom they are certain to overwhelm. Hard work for the love of the play and the glory of the Institute has made her defenders universally respected throughout the year as amateur athletes of the highest order. Their opponents have been worthy of the mettle of any collegiate sportsman and they have acquitted themselves cleanly and courageously on every occasion.

The insignia for the Gymnasium Team shall be gray letters on a red ground and for the Golf Team, red letters, on white.

The Advisory Council at its discretion may award the "T" with crossed rifles:

To members of the outdoor rifle team who shall score 143 or better out of a possible 150 at the outdoor competition of the N. R. A.

Members of the indoor rifle team who participate in two-thirds or more of the competitions of one season and demonstrate an excellence comparable to the preceding.

Competitors who shall win the "T" with crossed rifles more than once shall qualify for an award augmented with stars under the same rifles as those governing the "T" with stars.

To the six members of the outdoor rifle team and the manager, provided the team position in competition places it among the first third of the competing teams.

The members of the indoor rifle team who participate in two-thirds or more of the competitions of the season, providing the team be placed in Class A (the first third of the competing teams).

CREW AWARDS

At the discretion of the Advisory Council a BTc may be granted to members of the first crew who have competed in not less than two-thirds of the intercollegiate races of one season; under the same conditions, the same award augmented by the letters and placed beneath the "T" may be granted to members



### The Technique Award

OWARD WALKER DEXTER, JR., '23, has been presented with the Technique Cup for 1923. This award, made each year to the Institute's foremost track athlete, is based on a graded point system whereby each point scored in

the Intercollegiates counts five points towards the cup, each point in the New Englands, three points, each in a dual meet, two points, and each in the annual Interclass meet, one point.

Dexter, hailing from Jacksonville, Florida, entered the Institute in his sophomore year and for the three years he remained here was consistently a strong member of the track team. He was essentially a weight man, doing his best work with the shot and hammer, but his performance at the hurdles was creditable, placing him several times in this event. Thus his versatility as well as his uniformity of effort proved a factor in his value to the team.

Dexter participated in six meets during his senior year and it was his record in these that won him the award. He made a good start in the Interclass meet during Junior Week, taking two first places and a second, and helping his class towards an overwhelming victory. In the Maine meet he took second place in the high hurdles and tied for first in the low. His performances in the Intercollegiates were perhaps the outstanding ones of his career. Howard Walker Dexter, Jr. Here, he placed third, being surpassed only by Tootell, the record



breaker, and Hills of Princeton, and being one of the two men to score for Technology.

Dexter was always popular among his classmates and held several important positions in Institute activity life, in addition to his athletic activities.





Y the time the squad deserted the board track for the cinders, all were agreed that only the most diligent work could bring success against the strong field that would contest for the season's honors. The Interclass Meet allowed a number of promising performers to do their early season best. The Maine Dual Meet took place

in a heavy downpour and showed Technology to be the unqualified superior. The contest with Harvard was bitterly fought and the University team gained the upper hand at last, only by dint of marked ability in certain events. A dual meeting with Dartmouth was arranged for that college's Junior Week and the subsequent victory of the celebrating team must have added to their enjoyment of the holiday. Later, the New England Championship was snatched from the Engineers by a powerful Bowdoin team. The disappoint ment was particularly keen as Technology lacked but one victory of becoming the permanent possessor of the Briggs trophy.

Interclass Meet

On Friday, April 20, the classes were present on Tech Field to urge their champions to victory in the annual Junior Week Meet. As the events were

run off, it became evident that the Seniors held very much the upper hand. H. W. Dexter proved to be their most valuable entry. The weights were invincible in his hands and he managed to secure a third in the low hurdles as well. Other class stars were W. B. Gurney, '23, who took third in both the 440-yard run and the running broad jump, and second in the 220-yard dash, and F. W. Waterman, '24, who obtained a first place in the discus and a third in the 100-yard dash.

Those who looked for record-breaking performances were not disappointed. Emmons Blodgett, '24, in a hard-fought struggle at the 120-yard hurdles, turned in a time of 16

seconds flat, cutting down the previous record by twofifths second. Two old distance favorites, Sanborn and Hendrie, won the one- and two-mile runs respectively for 1923.

In the 440-yard run, Capt. A. D. Smith, '23, distanced Jeppe, '25, and the 100-yard dash fell to his classmate Heap, a consistent dash man.

Throughout the meet, the work of "ineligibles" featured. Among these were Fricker, Jeppe, Waterman and Chen, all of whom made enviable places for their respective classes.

The Seniors led at the final decision with  $70\frac{1}{2}$  points. The Juniors came second with 60, then the Sophomores with 21, and the Freshmen with  $13\frac{1}{2}$  points.

Maine Meet The meet with the University of Maine took place on April 28 at Orono and justified the optimism with which the team had

left Boston. The engineer track men, by a score of 81-44 nearly doubled that of their opponents, taking eleven of the fifteen first places. Institute men won both the half-mile run and the broad jump, and made a clean sweep of the low hurdles, as Maine failed to qualify in that event.

In the quarter mile, Captain Smith led Gurney of Technology at the finish with

Lawrence of Maine in third place. In the long-distance runs, Sanborn and Hendrie had no trouble in pulling well away from their fields. In the century dash, Heap of Technology was beaten by Thomas and Porter of Maine, but he was able to avenge himself by taking first place in the broad jump a few minutes later. Chink Drew made up for big Dexter's repeated fouls with the hammer by making his 128-foot heave take first place.

It is no wonder that Technology track enthusiasts looked forward to a brilliant season.

Harvard Meet

The action of this meet was characterized by unusual Crimson ability in five events. The University was well able to sweep the field in the javelin and shotput, and the Engineer entries reaped only small point places in the pole vault, discus throw and low hurdles.

Technology distinguished herself most in the hammer throw, taking the first two places, while the high jump yielded her a first place and a tie for the second. The advantage in the track events was

bitterly fought for, and in each of them, excepting the low hurdles, was wrested away from the Engineers by the closest of margins. Two dashes were won

by Technology, though the other scoring places were taken by Harvard. Hopes for second place in the 100-yard dash were frustrated when Heap was forced to drop out close to the finish because of a pulled tendon. Porter sprinted to the lead, but Chapin and Howard of Harvard crowded out any aspirant for second or third position. In the longer dash, Lou Porter again smashed Harvard hopes for the leading position. Chapin took second place for the University from Capt. Art Smith. Smith had just put forth his best efforts in the quarter-mile run which he lost by the narrowest of margins to Captain Burke of Harvard. Bill Gurney had assured the third scoring position to the Institute. As this run finished, it became evident that Smith had broken his own and the Institute's record unofficially. The struggle was a

memorable one, both men being on the verge of collapse as the finish line was neared.

Hendrie ran a typically strong two-mile race and led the first opponent by nearly a quarter lap. Bemis, however, was unable to take either of the next two scoring positions. Elmer Sanborn was pitted against the hardest competition in Cutcheon, a Harvard young-ster who had been doing phenomenal work throughout his freshman year. Elmer tried to tire him out, but only succeeded in losing some of his own steam at the finish when his younger rival took the lead away from him. Keplinger followed Sanborn in third place.

Hauers of Harvard, intercollegiate hurdles champion, had little trouble in winning the high hurdles in sixteen seconds. Blodgett of Technology beat Fletcher to second place. In the low hurdles, Ambach was the only Engineer to score, being able to carry off third place.

Although the field events brought few points to the Cardinal and Gray, Technology's athletes featured in the high jump and the hammer throw. Dexter won the larger weight event by a throw of 136 feet, with Drew's shot falling only a foot shorter and surpassing the Crimson try by several feet more. Greenough and McArdle took first and third places respectively in the high jump. Of the other events in this class the discus, javelin and shotput entries were outclassed by Harvard. Stewart of Technology, however, captured the broad jump. The final score showed an 81 to 54 defeat for Technology.

Dartmouth
Meet

Predominance in the field events is generally conceded to have given
Dartmouth the victory over Technology in the dual meet which took
place at Hanover on May 11. Until the weight events were called,
Captain Smith's men had every hope of winning the contest with no diminution of the
twelve point lead that they already enjoyed. Unfortunately, the weights seemed to be
the Dartmouth forte, for their men brought down first place in each event.

Capt. Art Smith proved, as usual, to be one of the highest Engineer point-winners. He was the first at the finish of the 440-yard run and was only nosed out by one man in

the 220-yard dash. Hendrie opened a half-lap between him and the nearest Green runner in his favorite two-mile grind. Allis helped out by allowing only one man to separate him from his leader.

Although Crawford, a Dartmouth man, won the 100-yard dash, second and third places were taken for Technology by Porter and Webster. Crawford also won the 220-yard event, but Smith and Gurney assured the decision by out-distancing the other Hanover men. When Blodgett and Dexter led the high hurdle field and Hershey and Ambach the lows, prospects looked bright. It took a disappointing succession of field defeats to give the Green the final 31-point lead, the score being 83-52.

Meet

I. C. A. A. A. A. For the third time in as many years, the University of California carried the Intercollegiate Championship back to the West with them. Princeton made a strong effort to keep

the title on this side of the Mississippi, but was forced to play second fiddle to the Californians whose 30½ points outnumbered those of the Tigers by 6½. Technology acquired five points with some difficulty and tied Lafayette and Rutgers for eleventh

place. These were accounted for when Dexter placed third in the hammer throw and Elmer Sanborn came in third in the mile run.

Before the meet was decided, spectators had seen two records broken. Tootell of Bowdoin reached the mark of 181 feet, 62 inches, with his hammer and Storr of California threw the javelin 199 feet, 1 inch.

Meet

N. E. I. C. A. A. A five-point margin sufficed to give Bow doin the victory in the annual struggle for the championship of New England,

held on Tech Field on May 18 and 19. With the trophy almost within reach, the Engineers stretched every nerve to annex the title, but the better balanced "down-east", team succeeded in maintaining a substantial advantage. Williams pressed Technology closely, but could not deprive her of second place. The meet had been under way but a few

hours when it became evident that Bowdoin's prowess had been seriously underestimated. The trials Friday, showed Technology in the lead with fifteen men doing consistent

and creditable work in eight events. At this point Bowdoin and Williams were tied, with Boston College, whom everyone expected to make a strong showing, giving but a poor account of itself.

five firsts and one second while Technology reversed the records with five seconds and one first. The only events in which the winners showed especial superiority were in the hammer and discus throws in which they were conceded first places without ever having had their position threatened. Other events were far more doubtful, but Captain Tootell's men continued to upset the predictions made on the previous day by winning the 120-yard hurdles, the half mile and the pole vault.

As the Engineers had been eliminated in four events — the 100-yard dash, the 220-yard dash, the high jump and the discus — in the trials, and Hendrie's long sickness had made his chances uncertain, the prospect now began to assume a serious aspect.

Hardy, the Bowdoin man who had come one-fifth second behind Coleman of Williams in the trials for the high hurdles, proved a big surprise when he executed a

sudden burst of speed that defeated Blodgett of Technology by a scant foot. Williams showed its ability in the dashes early in the meet. Miller won the 100-yard dash, and he with his team-mate, Dodge, took second and third places in the 220-yard event.

In the low hurdles, Technology had to be content with second and third places which were won by Hershey and Ambach after a hard fight. Sullivan of Boston College and Lovell of Bowdoin took the other scoring positions. The mile run provided an interesting spectacle to the onlookers. Elmer Sanborn never had much trouble in maintaining a respectable lead until near the finish, when Sargent of Bates hit up a pace that threatened to destroy Sanborn's advantage. The two-mile run gave the field a noteworthy example of real fighting courage in the performance of Bob Hendrie who held his place in the field with obvious diffi-

culty until the last lap, when exhaustion due to his recent illness, overcame him and forced his withdrawal. The real struggle was between McGinley of Bates and Cobb of Amherst. McGinley was able to sprint to a wide margin at the finish.

It was in this meet that Captain Tootell of Bowdoin broke the New England hammer record by a throw of 168 feet, 11 inches.

to overcome when later, at the New England Championships, it was forced to take sixth place. The I. C. A. A. A. A. championships also proved to be a disappointment. The strain of the previous week's run combined with curious reversals of form to give nine teams the right of way over the Cardinal and Gray at the finish.

Work for the cross country year began at a special training camp on the shores of Lake Winnepesaukee in New Hampshire, where the men were able to preserve strict training, run under the direction of Coach Connor twice daily and enjoy the opportunities for rest and recreation that the place affords. Captain "Gubby" Holt is directly responsible, by his forethought and management, for this unusual service to the team.

The Cornell Meet

On October 27, the Varsity cross country team repeated its victory of the last year over Cornell runners at Ithaca; the score

being 42 to 65. Fricker finished an easy first, with Bemis

The Harvard November 3 marked the team's second victory of the season, this time on the Harvard course at Cambridge. Fricker again made the best time. Cutcheon of Harvard took second place, followed by Rooney and Bemis of Technology. Chapin separated them from Duffy and Holt, the last two of their team-mates to score. The winner's time was 27:31.

The meet was held on November 10, on a five and one-fourth mile track at Princeton. The men ran well, Bemis, who received a bad Meet fall early in the race, pushing along gamely till his injured knee forced him out, but were obliged to take a 23–32 reverse from their opponents. Fricker again led the field by some 200 yards, but not another man scored until Duffy took fourth place. Holt in eighth was followed by Parkinson, Rooney and Keplinger. Fricker covered the course in 28 minutes, 51 seconds.

On Monday, November 26, Van Cortlandt Park, New York, was The I.C.A.A.A. the scene of the annual intercollegiate cross country meet. 


### Crew, 1923

In the spring, new equipment of machines and oars was added, seven shells were purchased, and another launch, to supplement the faithful "Wolf," arranged for The spring mass meeting on February 13 brought out about one hundred and fifty men and work was carried on during the remainder of the term on the machines, with supplementary track work and exercise. A radical change was made in the coaching

staff, Mr. Arthur W. Stevens taking entire charge, with Professor F. S. Dellenbaugh coaching the Varsity, and Lieutenant Harris taking care of the Freshmen and one hundred and fifty pounders.

The season opened against the Navy on the Severn, April 28, over the mile and five-sixteenths Henley distance. The Technology one hundred and fifty pound eight lost to the Middy plebe and second varsity crews by several lengths in the first race. The Engineer varsity lost to the Navy varsity by seven lengths in a second contest. Both Institute crews were characterized by their well-executed racing starts. The varsity crew led the winning boat for a short distance, but the quarter-mile mark seemed to put a period to their gain. All Technology's crews fell behind from that point on.




Varsity Boat

The Syracuse race seemed to mark the high point in the crew season, as the next and last race was lost to Columbia. On May 19, over the Henley distance on the Harlem both the Varsity and the one hundred and fifty pound crew (rowing as the Second Varsity) lost to their respective Metropolitan opponents. The one hundred and fifty pound crew had the disadvantage of being greatly outweighed, but managed to finish only three lengths behind the winner.

There were other crew races during the spring season. On May 5, the Freshmen lost to a heavier Yale Freshman crew over a two-mile course on the Housatonic. On the twelfth, Technology's one hundred and fifty pound boat lost to Harvard's lightweights over the Henley distance on the Charles in a very even race. The twenty-third of April saw the Freshmen, leading from the start, make an excellent showing in defeating the Huntington School over the mile course on the Charles. The first Richards' Cup race for inter-class crews was held on May 12, the Freshmen winning easily, with the Juniors, Sophomores and Seniors following in order.




Freshman and Sophomore Crews Under Way

### Swimming, 1923

HILE the swimming team entered the 1923 season with high hopes of recovering their lost laurels, they were doomed to a series of disappointments. The Beaver team won a close meet with Amherst, but lost to the stronger squads of Wesleyan, Army, Dartmouth, Navy and Brown. In the N. E. I. S. A. the title went to Brown, Captain Stewart's team getting third place.

The first meet of the year was with Wesleyan on January 20, and showed the Engineer veterans to be good on the relays, but poor on individual scoring. The final decision was 40-28, in favor of Wesleyan.

The second meet, January 27, was with West Point and while the team showed decided improvements in many events, they were still unable to take more than the 50-yard dash, won by Marsh, and the 100-yard breast stroke, won by Nauman. > the relay and the breast stroke, the winning of which assured the victory. Marsh made a brilliant showing, capturing eight points.



### Basketball, 1923

ANDIDATES for the teams were first called out on November 6, and within a few days there were forty Varsity and fifty Freshmen signed to report daily. D. B. West was secured as coach. The squad, led by Captain Cook, showed remarkably good spirit and worked hard during the weeks of practice that followed. A cut just before the Christmas vacation brought the squad down to reasonable proportions, so that, in spite of no formal practice during the holidays, the men were on their toes for the opening game on January 6.

On this date, the team barely nosed Northeastern out by 20-19. A better decision was gained over Tufts on the tenth, with a score of 23-13. C. K. Miller in the latter game gave his first indication of being the chief scorer for Technology by shooting six baskets from the floor. During the season he did the majority of the foul shooting and led the team in field goals. The first trip to New Hampshire State took place January 30 and brought a 31-13 defeat to the Institute team. In this game, as in all games away from home, the team seemed to lack the spirit that was very evident in the home games. Clark College was defeated on the next Wednesday, 35-20, at the Hangar, but the trip to the University of Vermont, the following week, brought another defeat, this time by 32-22. Wesleyan, on the twenty-seventh, administered the first defeat in two seasons to Tech-

nology on their home floor, and left the Hangar with a victory of 23-21. This was one of the fastest games of the season and in it was used the combination which proved most effective of all, Captain Cook at forward with Johnston in the guard position, Coleman at center, and Miller and Hubbard the other forward and guard. The team lost to Amherst 45-30 and to Massachusetts Aggies 19-14 in two hard-fought games away from home, early in the month. During the next two weeks Holy Cross was trounced 37-23, but this was more than offset when Brown took their battle by 34-20 soon afterward. Three victories followed when the University of Maine was beaten by Storb's last-minute field goal 21-20, Boston College lost 28-20 and Worcester, fighting hard, finally succumbed to the tune of 27-25. Harvard dealt the team its last defeat for the season, for the final game was an overwhelming 34-10 victory over Norwich. The final summary of this rather mottled









# Boxing, 1923

APTAIN MOLL had the misfortune to lead his team to more defeats than one during the season, but he and his men, by their clean fighting and sportsman-like behavior, won the unqualified respect of each of their opponents. The loss of four out of the five meets held during the season demonstrated the proficiency of individuals, but showed a fatal weakness in some events and a lack of sufficient substitutes.

Lew Phillips and Captain Moll easily won decisions for their respective classes and Al Lindsey, by clever close-work, managed to carry off his bout. A draw was declared with the score 3-3. A week later, February 10, the team met the University of Pennsylvania at Philadelphia. Lew Phillips and another man were out of the game and it is thought that this handicap

denied the men what might have been another drawn battle. Moll and Lindsey were again the star performers of the meet which, nevertheless, was recorded as a 3-2 defeat. Another week found Yale at the Hangar gymnasium for a trial of strength. Their team was an exceptional one and, with Captain Moll fighting in two classes, the Engineers were forced to accept a reverse of 5-1. Phillips, alone, won his bout.

On Washington's birthday the team met the University of Virginia on its own ground. The long railway trip seemed to affect the men unfavorably for they suffered a 4-2 defeat after an extremely pugnacious series of bouts. Al Lindsey's absence on this trip probably contributed to the disaster. The Navy outboxed the Institute on the twenty-fourth of February at Annapolis, as a 6-o decision showed. The perfect condition of the midshipmen assured them an easy victory.

# Gym, 1923

A sadly depleted gym team became a pressing one. The high bar, parallel bars, and the tumbling squad needed the most support and it was to this end that the twenty-five recruits who presented themselves were employed. Practice, both for the varsity and the freshman squads, was held first three times a week, and later four times a week in preparation for the unusually difficult program ahead.

The first meet scheduled for the season was a triangular one with Harvard and the University of Pennsylvania which was held in the Technology Gymnasium. Two hundred spectators saw the Engineers decisively carry off the honors of the occasion. They doubled Harvard's score of 14 points by winning 29 and the U. of P. fared still more poorly with but 12 points. February 23 found the team in New York in preparation for the meet with Princeton. This was fought out on that evening before a small gathering, and resulted in a disappointing 36–9 defeat. J. T. McCoy took first place on the rings, Ruiz second place with the parallel bars and Captain Vicinus third place on the horse.

The Princeton meet over, the team returned to New York and set out for Baltimore

to meet the Naval Academy gymnasts. The Army-Navy basketball game, a boxing match with Technology and a wrestling match with Penn State were all run off during the same afternoon as the gym meet, so that a large and distinguished audience was present. The results of an overwhelming defeat for the Engineers were made less trying by the splendid treatment received at the hands of the Midshipmen.

The closest score of the season was witnessed by a large crowd in the home gymnasium when Technology beat Yale 23-22.

A week later, the team met Harvard again and had to be content with a  $24\frac{1}{2}$  to  $20\frac{1}{2}$  victory. Dartmouth won the last meet of the season with a score of  $32\frac{1}{2}$  to  $12\frac{1}{2}$ . This score, possibly, showed the effect of the




# Field Day

OVEMBER 2, the day set for Field Day, saw weather conditions as nearly perfect as could be asked for by the most ardent follower of the afternoon's sports. Eager eyes were turned up-river to discern the leading crew as it passed under the bridge. After a moment of indecision, it became evident that the sophomore crew

had established a slight lead and the hopes of its supporters were confirmed a few moments later when the red jerseys crossed the line as winners.

The Relay Race provided its customary quota of thrills to a grandstand that rocked with the plaudits of excited partisans. That a runner should drop the baton in passing seems to have become a tradition and the results as usual proved disastrous to the freshman hopes of victory.

Tug-of-War impressions are always the same. A long line of jerseys, red and gray, leaning uniformly and kicking stolidly, a rope as taut as a bar of iron, and a white handkerchief which crawled slowly to the sophomore side of the field at each pull - these comprise the event to all who witnessed it.



Rushing the '27 Banner The Football Game was watched with particular interest as the most undecided sport of the day. Typical Field Day football, with more vigor than head work and plenty of fumbling and penalties, characterized the play from the start. When the game was over, the stands rapidly emptied and the triumphal snake dance formed.

While the student body ate lunch, raced frantically after hostile armbands, The or lined the river bank to wait for the crews and listen to the Field Day Crew Race Band, the crew men made their way to the boathouse to prepare, hastily, for the first of the day's contests. The toss-up resulted in the selection of the Cambridge

side of the river by Captain Greer of the Sophomores, and the shells moved to the starting position, just east of the Cottage Farm Bridge. Dr. A. W. Rowe started the

race, and both crews were off with a fairly high count. Tappan, freshman stroke, kept up the initial thirty-six until his shell had reached the quarter-mile mark, but the 1926 boat dropped immediately to a steady thirty-two. The shells remained abreast of each other until they reached the Harvard Bridge which, as usual on Field Day, was lined three deep with cheering spectators. Here the freshman cox called for a higher stroke, and immediately his boat began to take the lead. After waiting a few moments, Greer slowly raised his stroke. The shell forged ahead, passed the bow of the

yearling boat, and slid across the line with a bare quarter-length advantage. The time of the winning boat was 5:25%.

Neptune had been particularly favorable to the contending crews and an almost glassy Charles aided the rival shells. When the sophomore shell had poked its length over the finish line it was found to have broken the Field Day Crew record by 11 seconds.

As the first pistol shot took the slack out of the heavy black rope in the Tug-of-War hands of the jerseyed and heavily booted warriors, it would have been difficult to pick the probable winner. The second year counters soon showed their superior knowledge of the tugging art and their followers' experience in the wiles of the sport. After a few moments of straining hesitation, the heavier sophomore string took advantage of a momentary weakening of the more inexperienced squad and pulled the handkerchief across the line. The time of the pull was 1:09. The second pull came between the halves of the football game. As the results of the game were undecided, this might make up the winning number of points, so the younger engineers dug in their

toes and succeeded in holding the sophomores for a few seconds longer. But the weightier team was not to be denied and slowly the freshmen were pulled across the

line. The time for the second pull was 1:48. It is to be remembered that 1926 won this event their first year.

The Relay Race Davidson and Rick ran the first positions for the sophomores and freshmen respectively. The start was even, but Davidson gave the baton to Foster with a three yard advantage over the frosh runner. This gap remained unchanged until the beginning of the third lap, when Heyser slowly opened it to six yards, leaving Kauzmann behind. In the middle of the lap, the latter struck his stride, and

regained the ground he had lost. Smith, the next frosh runner, gained on Elmendorf, until scarcely a yard separated the two. The sophomores regained, and then lost, several yards when McCue led Mercer around the fifth lap. The baton was dropped in passing from Mercer to Coolidge and this delay gave the sophomores a lead of nearly twenty yards. The realization that the race was hopeless seemed to come over the frosh runners, and the next sophomores increased the distance between the sprinters to fifty yards. The last lap between the two captains, Copley, '26 and Wiebe, '27, was easy for the sophomores, who crossed the line nearly a quarter of a lap ahead of the freshman. The time for the race was 4:56.

The Football Game

As the game time approached, both teams were obviously only too anxious to begin the fray, and a short signal drill sufficed for each squad. In less than two minutes after the opening whistle, Cargile, right half for 1927, made a fumble which was snapped up by Jewell, sophomore right end, and carried forty yards for the first touchdown of the game. Bianchi, 1926 back,

failed in his attempt to kick the goal, and the score stood 6-o in favor of his team. Apparently, this was enough punishment for the Freshmen, whose offensive began a series of plunges through the opposing line for five and ten yard gains. The Sophomore line wilted for a time before these attacks, but came to a sullen and determined halt on its own two yard line. 1927 then lost the ball on downs and the older team lined up for a punt. Volante, right guard for the freshmen, succeeded in plunging through, neatly blocked the punt, and fell on the ball behind the line. Cline's failure to kick the goal left the score at 6-6.

In the second quarter, the spectators were treated to a brand of real football. Cargile uncorked a series of puzzling ten, fifteen, and twenty yards foward passes; his teammates responding to a man. The Sophomores rarely held the ball long, but uncannily managed to keep 1927 a fairly safe distance from their goal line.

In the last half, the yearlings sent Cargile and Brown through the line for five and ten yard advances. The last moments of play were characterized by stalling on the part of both coaching staffs. With but two minutes to play, seven men were substituted from the sidelines and when the referee's whistle sounded, the ball lay on the fifty yard line, near the side lines, with the score at 6–6.

HE Advisory Council has for its purpose the furtherance of publication facilities, the supervision of all undergraduate work to appear in print and the encouragement of sound policies on the part of Technology periodicals. Its attitude is one of encouragement towards every branch of truly representative literary pursuit.

It was founded in 1910 by the Institute Committee in response to a widely felt need for cooperation between the alumni and undergraduates in the management of publications. The Alumni Council was asked to form a connecting link between the alumni and these activities. This it accomplished by means of the Advisory Council on Undergraduate Publications, the capacity of which was to be in loco parentis to The Tech, TECHNIQUE, Voo Doo, and The Tech Engineering News, both in time of financial uncertainty and in the event of radical changes in style or service.

A Constitution making clear the relationship of this Council to the Alumni Council, the Institute Committee and the activities concerned, was approved by the executive committee of the Alumni Council and the Institute Committee.

The concepts which govern the operation of undergraduate publications under its jurisdiction as stated in this document are:

3. (a) "The Alumni have a direct interest and a right to a voice in the management of any student activity that trades in the good-will of the Institute as a whole and by which the good name of the Institute might be compromised. . ."

4. (b) "The Alumni claim no right or desire to interfere in any student activity not involving the principle outlined in (a) except insofar as their advice may be requested, or proffer of it may appear to be in order."

The Council has fostered the foundation of trustee funds on the part of the publications with the idea that the result may be instrumental in the purchase of an independent Publications Building.





# Freshman Gray Book

A NEW Technology publication enjoyed its first birthday on January 12, 1924, the day that "The Freshman Gray Book 1927" reached its subscribers. Its appearance was intended to meet the much felt need for a medium which would enable the incoming men to become acquainted with each other, and would provide the



faculty, the fraternities and the Information Office with more intimate details in regard to the freshmen than could be obtained elsewhere.

To this end, plans made during the summer were acted upon immediately after the opening of the Institute in the fall. The result was a sixty-four page booklet bound in heavy gray paper and bearing the title "The Freshman Gray Book" embossed in cardinal. The first forty pages constituted the portfolio section. The pictures were framed in strips of five across the top and bottom of the pages, while in the center were the names, nicknames, home town, preparatory schools and preparatory school activities of each man.

Following the portfolio section came a list of 1927 men pledged to fraternities during the fall term, a resume of freshman sports, an account of Field Day, and a list of fall sports candidates. A

few pages on Activities giving the advantages to be gained from different fields closed the book except for a brief advertising section.

"The Freshman Gray Book" was an experiment. It was written and edited by sophomore members of the Technique staff with the idea that if the venture proved at all successful, it would be taken up as a regular feature of Institute life from year to year.

Seniors captured eight out of fifteen first places and received a scoring position in all but three events. The other classes followed in order, each contest on the schedule being of the closest kind.

The feature interfraternity relay race was won by Alpha Chi Sigma after two preliminary heats won by them and Theta Delta Chi. The Advisory Council on Athletics presented a new cup to the winner of this race as a perpetual challenge.

The Spring Concert included many of the numbers that had made the Clubs popular with the alumni and friends of the Institute during its winter season, and was received with the most enthusiastic appreciation by a typical Junior Week audience. Refreshments filled the interval that followed the last concert number. Then the dance began. The Prom Girl was in her element during the hours of dancing to the accompaniment of the Club's own orchestra.

Meanwhile, Tech Show had been enjoying an unusually prosperous season. Two evening performances and a matinee had delighted full houses and another season of conquests was assured.



TECH Show emerges for another year! The blaze of high lights, the mellow strains of its tuxedoed orchestra playing the refrain of the first song hit, the practiced sway and kick of the painted and bobbed-haired "chorus," and the applause of first-night audiences have announced its twenty-sixth procession of triumphs.

From the day that the first call for candidates brings out a hundred would-be actors,

"ladies and gentlemen of the ensemble," and ballet dancers, to the Prom Performance of Junior Week which rings down the final curtain of Tech Show 1924, the most intensive work prevails both in the management offices in Walker and the Commons Room at Rogers where all but the dress rehearsals are conducted. In fact the Show has reached such proportions that the pioneers who helped make the early "Tech Minstrel Shows" would never recognize this sturdy offspring of their first attempts. The "outfit," as its members fondly refer to it, goes on the road with a complete private train including sleeping, baggage, and property cars. The scenery is designed anew each year and the costume and lighting effects are made the results of a long and detailed study. It is no wonder that the performances present the elaborate and finished air of professional productions.

This year's Show follows the usual

popular musical comedy theme with a plot full of amusing and romantic situations and a book full of original and catchy songs.

The action of "The Hidden Idol" takes place in Kookoostan, a little principality in the mountains of northern India. A motion picture is in the making, backed by ner-

vous little Professor Summerwell, a famous ethnologist, whose real object of course, is the discovery of a certain mysterious hidden idol, reputed to hold the secret of a lost race. Philip Wainwright, hero-director of the production and fiance of Minerva, the Professor's daughter, is finding himself badly hampered by a company of "ham" actors. Through

their relationship to the Professor both Minerva and her emphatic, impressionable mother have parts in the picture, much to the disgust of Buster Brown, Phil's chum and devil-may-care camera-man. Buster claims he's hard, not being scared to chew gum in front of a cop and all that sort of thing, but just the same when it comes to Mrs. Summerwell's acting—words simply couldn't express it. Then there is Pansy, the Summerwell's apprehensive colored maid, and her parrot, Chester, born and bred before the mast. Through some subtle psychic channel Chester has developed a mighty complex with regard to Pansy's mistress.

The first act opens on location in a pass in the Karakorum Mountains. Work is over for the day and during the sunset hours the party has become quite wrought up over the unaccountable beating of unseen tom-toms. In the midst of the suspense Buster

appears in camp with a little native dancing girl and tries to get her to dance for him. The complications are sundry and humorous, but upon Phil's arrival, the girl, with inexplicable promptness, consents to dance. During the dance Phil saves her from being carried away by two priests of the Temple of Gar. It develops that the girl is <code>Hasahdha</code>, the temple dancer. She is quite overcome for the moment and is found by Minerva in

Phil's arms. Minerva, henceforth and thereupon, proceeds to break off the engagement. Buster, in line of duty, tries to explain to Minerva, but on failure congratulates Phil on his escape. At this point Henry Judd, an old British Tommy, adds a strange story to the plot. As his tale draws to a close, the camp is surrounded and General High-Commander Allaghab, breaking in on the scene, gallantly informs the company assembled that it is their honor to be under his arrest, in the name of the Maharajah.

The second act is at the palace of the Maharajah, where the company is comfortably instated under the questionable designation as guests. Their comfort is soon disturbed by the fact that Phil and Buster manage to get in wrong with the Maharajah and are





delegated to the servitude of the General. The Rajah turns out to be a regular old snake and spends all his time entertaining the ladies. Meanwhile, Buster, with Pansy's aid, has won over the General and the entire army. Strangely enough, the General is an American gentleman of color and is blessed with the usual weakness for co'n pone'n 'lasses

and also a wonderful regard for the flying dominoes. By this time the Rajah and Minerva have actually fallen in love with each other, aided and abetted by the sentimentality of Mrs. Summerwell. When the Rajah learns that the army has revolted and sworn allegiance to a person they call King Buster, he is exceeding wroth, as the saying goes, and takes Minerva and Hasahdha to the Temple of Gar. The rest of the party are seized with consternation and fear when they find that the girls have been carried away. A rescue party is immediately started.

The third act has its action in the Temple of Gar where things are complicated by the religious ceremonials of the priests. Phil is very anxious for Buster to get some pictures of the Temple and leaves him grinding away behind a pillar, while he goes in search of the General and the army. Buster overhears the Rajah's unsavory plans for the future of the Summer-

well party and is not a little disturbed thereby. He manages to send Pansy after Phil. A little later the Rajah, with Minerva at his side, lines everyone up in front of the altar at the point of his gun. Minerva stands placidly by, entirely undisturbed about the fate of her people. Why? Herein lies the story.

The 1924 management has taken cognizance of the fact that the trip to Northampton which, in former years, took place the day after the Prom in Junior Week and actually started early that morning, was anything but pleasant for the weary players. As a consequence, they have rearranged the schedule so that Smith College is visited during the New York trip in the March recess. The Simmons performance was also dropped from the list and an extra stand taken for the trip to fill its place.






and Technology taking place on the 29th of March at the Hotel Somerset enjoyed the best of support from the friends of both institutions.







> these, space permitting, but we must be content with turning the spot light on a few of the major events.



Many will have finished this lap of the race of life in June, and the torch of responsibility will be thrown to those who follow. May they "carry on."




The Dorms and the President's House from the Top of Walker

# Inauguration

THE inauguration of Doctor Samuel Wesley Stratton as President of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology took place on the morning of June 11, 1923. The preceding night the dome over the Institute Library had been bathed in colored lights, arranged to produce the effect of a spectrum. Across the river was stationed a powerful searchlight, the rays from which swept the buildings from end to end.

At ten o'clock, on the morning of the inauguration the Senior Class, in academic regalia, gathered at Doctor Stratton's home on Memorial Drive to escort the president-to-be to the exercises. There a procession formed. Doctor Stratton's machine followed by the Colors, occupied the center of the long, double file of black-robed Seniors who marched over the Harvard Bridge and along Massachusetts Avenue to Horticultural Hall. Here, delegates from colleges and universities in this country and abroad, and representatives of the Faculty, the Corporation and the Alumni waited to join the procession to Symphony Hall.

The route from Horticultural Hall to Symphony Hall was quickly lined with orderly ranks of robed Seniors, and it was down the lane thus formed that the academic procession passed. Among the uniformly somber academic garb of the Americans, the brightly

colored hoods of the English representatives of Cambridge and Oxford contrasted strangely. When the long file of distinguished personages had passed into Symphony Hall, the line of Seniors closed into a column and slowly entered the building where they were seated directly in front of the platform. The system of marshalling used was such that the conduct of the ceremony was remarkable for its orderliness.





#### SENIOR WEEK



Simplicity marked the exercises which took place here. After an invocation by the Reverend George A. Gordon and an organ interlude, Mr. Frederick P. Fish gave an address of greeting in behalf of the Corporation. Other orations of a salutatory nature were delivered for the Commonwealth, the National Government, and the Founders, by Governor Channing H. Cox, Major-General George O. Squier, and Dr. Charles W. Eliot, President-Emeritus of Harvard and member of the Institute Faculty. The Alumni was not without its spokesman in the person of Professor Charles E. Winslow, '98, and the Faculty paid its respects to the new President through Professor Edward F. Miller, '86. The words of President John C. Merriam of the Carnegie Institute of Technology concluded the addresses of appreciation.

At this point, President Stratton rose to deliver his inaugural address. He reviewed the rapid growth of science and skill in engineering and pointed out the vast difference that exists between the expensive laboratories of today and the meager experimental equipment available a half century ago. Enlarging upon this point, the President cited the case of a noted Continental scientist who, a number of years ago, received an awestricken visitor who begged to be allowed to see the laboratory with which the famous man performed his marvels, whereupon the scientist rang for his servant and had him bring it "on a tray." The modern laboratory, he reminded his audience, was furnished with apparatus ranging from the most ponderous machinery to the most delicate examples of the instrument maker's art.

An audience composed of Seniors, Alumni, and prominent persons in all fields of science, education, and government heartily applauded Doctor Stratton's first words as President of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.




The Senior Marshals Lead the Parade to Symphony Hall

# Class Day

E. Rogers, who, in a characteristic vein, described the origin of Caps and Gowns and their use among students of medieval times. Professor Rogers commented upon the changed order of graduation now that theses are no longer read. His amusing conception of the titles of those that might have been read had the custom been continued, was laughingly appreciated. In his talk, H. J. Carlson, '92, president of the Alumni Association, urged his audience to be original thinkers. His declaration that one obtains far more than "slipstick knowledge" from Technology, concluded the more serious part of the program.

F. D. Gage and J. P. Keegan next characterized members of the faculty in a series of vaudeville acts. A small rubber balloon, with a cardboard "T" attached, was released and allowed to float up to the top of the building. At this point, several members of the R. O. T. C., commanded by "General "P. P. Pratt stumbled onto the stage, burlesqued an inspection of arms, and finally, after three volleys, brought the brightly colored sphere down into the hands of a group of seniors, who presented it to Dr. Stratton.

## The Class Picnic

The impatient crowd formed a surging sea of class-colored caps as they stood at Massachusetts Avenue later on, waiting for the special cars that were to carry them to Rowe's Wharf and the Pemberton steamer. #### THE POPS



In so participating, he warned them to remember that "fundamental changes in political and social institutions are best made slowly."

Mr. Lee pointed out the French and Russian revolutions as examples of changes not in accordance with this rule and went on to assert his confidence in the political solidity of America. "In this country," he continued, "I do not think there is the slightest fear that revolutionary measures on the same scale could possibly be given









# The R. O. T. C. at Technology

The Department of Military Science and Tactics at the Institute owes its inception to an Act of Congress passed in 1862 requiring the maintenance of such a branch of

instruction at every institution enjoying, as did the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, a grant of land from the Federal Government. For years after the founding of the Department, the Freshmen only were required to take military training. The Cadets, as they were called, must have been an impressive sight as they fell into line for parade or strode home at twilight with an effort to seem unconcerned. The uniform was cut in the best Gettysburg style, blue of various shades, and surmounted by a variety of subway guard hat.

In 1916, Congress passed the National Defense Act which re-stated and revised the defense policy of the United States and under which the Coast Artillery Unit of the Reserve Officers' Training Corps was organized at the Institute just a year later.

at the Institute just a year later.

When this country entered the World War, the Students' Army Training Corps, acting purely as a war-time measure, supplanted the Reserve Officers' Training Corps for the time being, and it was not until its last member had been discharged, that the Reserve Corps returned to its normal organization.

Both Freshmen and Sophomores must receive instruction — the former in close order infantry drill and the latter in such subjects as topography, infantry weapons, and military field engineering.

Present figures show that fully half the students eligible elect to take the Advanced Courses offered by the Department. They are then allowed to enlist in whatever unit most interests them and best co-ordinates with their curriculum. Among these units are the Coast Artillery Corps, the Engineer Corps, the Ordnance Corps, and the Signal Corps. The Department has been authorized to form a Chemical Warfare Unit next fall. This will be the first Reserve Officers' Training Corps unit of its kind in this country and is expected to interest men enrolled in the chemical courses at the Institute. The Advanced Courses lead to a commission in the United States Reserve Corps. A Student Officer receiving the "Honor Graduate" rating receives a commission in the Regular Service.




In Battalion Formation

Battalion Parade followed, in all the impressiveness of the fired salute to the descending flag and the playing of the National Anthem. The precision with which every movement was executed could not have been improved upon by a body of Regulars.

# The Presentation of Medals

OR excellency in the handling of small arms, three prizes for first, second and third grade proficiency were offered this past year. These took the form of gold, silver

Weeks before the Review, the first of the competitive drills, that were to decide the winners of these medals, had been conducted. If his rifle was a thought out of line or his heels not "as close together as the conformation of the man permits," he was

the conformation of the man permits," he was ruthlessly eliminated. In this manner, five men were finally selected from each drill section to represent that section at the final contest.




The Medals

That time came on the afternoon of the Review. Before the battalion appeared upon the parade ground, the group of men who had survived the drill-section cuts were given the opportunity of demonstrating their proficiency in the entire school of the soldier. The inspection of equipment and manual of arms served to cut the original twenty-five to six. These were put through a still more critical inspection of their performances, being required to execute the various facings and parts of the manual of arms in quick succession. In this way the elimination continued until but three men remained. The presentation medals was made by Major-General Brewster himself. He spoke a few words of commendation, pinning the medals in their places and shaking hands with the winners. The "privates" who received this honor as a result of their proven superiority, were, in the order of the awards, Roland Deming Earle, Kenneth Charles Hawthorne and Karl French.




Cavalry Crossing Spar Bridge Constructed by Engineer Unit

Fourteen-Inch Disappearing Sea-Coast Gun at Ordnance Unit Summer Camp

THE Reserve Officers' Training Corps conducts summer camps for the further training of its members in the units which they have chosen. These camps are classified under two general heads — the Basic Camps and the Advanced Camps. The Basic Camp, which may be attended at the end of the first or second year, is optional on the part of the student and confers no obligation upon him except that he be protected against small-pox and typhoid fever. Commutation for the round trip to the camp is provided him together with subsistence, quarters, clothing and medical attendance during the six weeks camping period.

The Advanced Camps offer, in addition to advanced work in a chosen unit under the same favorable conditions as the Basic Camps, the pay of the Seventh Grade of the United States Army. These camps, attendance at which is required of those taking the Advanced Course, are located near good-sized cities where opportunities for social and athletic activities are plentiful. Every effort has been made in the past to stimulate such interests out of camp by granting the men generous leaves and providing good means of transportation.

# Institute Expansion

EVER since Technology moved into its new quarters on the west bank of the Charles, expansion has been the watchword of those who guard her future. The original plans for a completed Technology have been altered and the scheme now adopted calls for advances that were almost unhoped for by the earlier enthusiasts.

This year has seen two more additions of great note; namely, the purchase of a large tract of land on the west side of Massachusetts Avenue abreast of the Institute and the construction of a new dormitory unit.

The new dormitory, which has been named "93 Hall" was built from funds contributed by members of the Institute class of 1893. Nine-three has been called the "millionaire class" because at least six of its members have attained that classification, and it has been through the generosity of these men that one of Technology's most crying needs—that for new student quarters,—has been, in part, fulfilled. The money was donated during the summer with the condition that work be started on the building by September first. This was done and labor has gone on continuously so that the new hall will be finished in the spring and ready for occupancy by the fall term of 1924. The structure is of uniform construction with the rest of the Institute buildings but

has a few improvements over the old dorms in interior work. The rooms are all to be arranged as adjoining single chambers, so that a group can make any suite arrangement they see fit. The unit is so designed that projected additions can be made without difficulty. Situated on Ames Street behind Walker Memorial, it provides a very convenient place of residence for new and old students.

The purchase of about thirty acres of land to the west of Massachusetts Avenue was announced by President Stratton at the Alumni Banquet in January. A large part of the land was bought from the funds of the Institute, the option on the rest being taken up by money subscribed by the Alumni, \$125,000 of which was given by Coleman duPont '84. Definite plans for what is to be done with this land have not yet been announced. It will probably be used for more dormitories, mechanical laboratories, a new gymnasium, an infirmary, and architectural buildings to take the place of Rogers Building.

# The Massachusetts Institute of Technology

CAMBRIDGE

THE MASSACHUSETTS INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY offers Courses, each of four years' duration, in Civil, Mechanical and Electrical Engineering; Naval Architecture and Marine Engineering; Mining Engineering and Metallurgy and Geology and Geological Engineering; Architecture and Architectural Engineering; Chemistry, Chemical Engineering and Electrochemical Engineering; Biology and Public Health and Sanitary Engineering; Physics, General Science and General Engineering and in Engineering Administration. These Courses lead to the Degree of Bachelor of Science.

To be admitted to the first-year class, applicants must have attained the age of seventeen years, and must satisfactorily fulfill entrance requirements in Algebra, Plane and Solid Geometry, Trigonometry, Physics, Chemistry, English, History, and French or German and one elective subject. Examinations are required in all subjects except Chemistry, History and the elective, the requirements for which are fulfilled by the presentation of satisfactory certificates. A division of these entrance subjects between different examination periods is permitted.

Entrance examinations are held at the Institute in September. In June, applicants will be examined by the College Entrance Examination Board in Boston, New York, Philadelphia, Chicago, and many other cities in America and Europe. A circular stating times and places is issued in advance by the College Board.

Graduates of colleges and scientific schools of collegiate grade, and in general all applicants presenting satisfactory certificates showing work done at another college corresponding to at least one year's work at the Institute, are admitted, without examination, to such advanced standing as is warranted by their previous training.

Master in Architecture, Doctor of Philosophy and Doctor of Science
are also offered. Special Research Laboratories of Physical Chemistry,
