

# Electronics recycling at MIT



## TechnoCycle Bins:

- All electronic media and their cases: diskettes, zip disks, CDs, CD-Rs, CD-RWs, DVDs, video tape, audio tape, game cartridges, DAT, DLT and virtually all other computer tapes
- Hard drives, Zip and Jaz drives, jump drives, etc.
- All printer cartridges including both inkjet and toner
- All cell phones, pagers, PDAs and their chargers, cables, and headset accessories
- All rechargeable batteries (alkaline batteries should go in the trash) and their chargers
- All small computer accessories such as MP3 players, iPods, digital cameras, hand-held scanners, handheld games and other connected devices
- All cords, cables, boards, chips, etc. attached to (or removed from) a computer
- Laptop computers

**TechnoCycle (formerly called TechnoTrash) bin locations are in the process of being re-designated.**

## Monitors, CPUs, Keyboards and Mice; Printers, Fax Machines and Other Equipment; Large volumes of TechnoCycle:

1. Items with an MIT sticker must be deactivated by the Property Office before equipment can be recycled. Call 3-2779.
2. Submit an Internal Provider Requisition via SAPweb OR call 3-6350.
3. Select Dept. of Facilities as the vendor and in the "Item Note" field type *MIT Movers*.
4. Note the amount of materials to be recycled.
5. Supply an account number and put \$1.00 in the price field. (You pay only for the Movers' time, so Facilities will adjust the costs after the pickup).
