



Instructions for PANIC 2011 Proceedings

Proceedings submission deadline is Monday, August 29.

You must submit a signed paper copy of the Transfer of Copyright Agreement in order for your contribution to be published. Copies will be available at the Registration Desk and Speakers' Bureau during the conference. If not done at that time, you can print, sign, and mail the pdf included on the USB drive.

Late submissions have a high probability of being excluded from the proceedings.

The Proceedings for the PANIC 2011 conference will be published by the American Institute of Physics as part of their Conference Proceedings series.

The page limits are 8 pages for plenary talks, 5 pages for 25 minute parallel talks and 3 pages for 15 minute parallel talks. Speakers who are members of larger collaborations can include links to posted full collaboration author lists.

Speakers are strongly encouraged to generate their contributions using LaTeX and are responsible for ensuring that their files process correctly using **only** the files they submit and those provided by AIP (see further instructions below). Care should be taken to include any “personal” definitions in the submitted file(s). Please do not make any modifications to the AIP files.

Submissions should be e-mailed as attachments, either as separate files or preferably as tar files, to panic11-proceedings@lns.mit.edu. Please send only the files unique to your contribution, not the files supplied by AIP.

Please include both your talk ID and your last name in your contribution filename, for example 5K4_Stephans.tex

Information on how to format your submission, including an example template and all necessary LaTeX files, can be found on the author section of the AIP conference proceedings web site: http://proceedings.aip.org/authors/information_for_authors

Note that the PANIC proceedings will use the 8x11 single column format.

Although LaTeX format is strongly preferred, contributions can also be generated with Microsoft Word. Such contributions must be formatted correctly according to the AIP requirements. See the AIP web for more information.

For your convenience, all necessary LaTeX files and instructions are also included on the USB drive provided to all participants in a folder labeled “For PANIC Speakers”.
